









Mussolini and Fascism

- Which leader was one of the first dictators? Benito Mussolini
 - Mussolini established the totalitarian regime in Italy.
 - 1919, Mussolini pushed war veterans to fight the politicians...starting Fascism.
 - Fascists: strong dictator = national greatness = empire






- Mussolini was anticommunist and wanted Italy to be a great world power:
 - Promised to return Italy to the glory of the Roman Empire.
 - 1921: Fascist party gained 35 parliament seats.
 - 1922: Mussolini threatened to march on Rome...protecting Rome from Communism!
 - King Victor Emmanuel III appointed Mussolini premier of Italy (Prime Minister)
- How did Mussolini respond to his leadership role?
 - Mussolini called himself "Il Duce" which means "the Chief"

Stalin takes over the Soviet Union

- 1922: Vladimir Lenin created the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR)
 - One party rule (no opposition)
 - Suppression of individual liberties
 - Punishment of opponents
- Lenin died in 1924, leaving a power vacuum!
 - Lenin wanted Leon Trotsky to lead the party
 - Stalin orchestrated a "coup" to completely take power!






- Who is Joseph Stalin?
 - Son of a shoemaker who studied to become a priest
 - Began to read Marxist literature in college
 - He worked against the monarchy
 - Played a role (small role) in the 1917 revolutions
 - Stalin rises through the Bolshevik party ranks
- 1926: Stalin has complete control!
 - Five Year Plans: created industry through "collectives"
 - 20 million people died under his rule: famines or punishment
 - Called for a worldwide takeover by the USSR

Hitler and Nazi Germany

- How did Hitler's childhood shape his life?
 - Son of Alois and Klara Heidler (~18 years age difference between parents).
 - Dad was emotionally harsh did not approve of Hitler's interest in fine arts!
 - Became detached from family after brother's death.
 - 1903: father died suddenly
 - 1905: mother allowed Hitler to drop out of school
 - Rejected by Academy of Fine Arts –
 TWICE!







- Did Hitler serve in WWI?
 - YES! Served mostly away from the front
 - Wounded at the Battle of the Somme (gas)
 - End of WWI, Hitler became a drifter.
 - Eventually hired to be a spy for the German Army
- Who did he spy on? NSDAP (future Nazi Party)
 - The National Socialist German Workers Party
 - One of the leaders of the Beer Hall Putsch.
 - Prison: wrote Mein Kampf (My Struggle)

- What is in Mein Kampf?
 - Advocated for the aryan "master" race (German ideal of blond hair/blue eyes)
 - Hatred of the Slavic peoples (Eastern Europeans)
 - Blamed the Jewish people for the problems of the world...Anti-Semitism.
 - Nazism was based on extreme nationalism!






MITLER News or hard

- Followed a power path similar to Mussolini...
 - Determined to get the party elected to the Reichstag (lower house of German Parliament)
 - Germany turned to radical parties during the Depression...Nazis and Communists!
 - 1932: Nazis were the largest party in the Reichstag!
 - Hitler was appointed chancellor of Germany (like a prime minister)
 - Storm Troopers began to intimidate opponents
 - 1934: Hitler declared himself "president" calling himself "Der Fuhrer"
- 1938: Hitler was named Time Magazine "Man of the Year"

Militarists Control Japan

- What about Japan?
 - Japan also experienced the Depression
 - Japanese problems were blamed on "corrupt politicians" (really it was a combination of problems)
 - Japanese people wanted to dominate East Asia!





Military Control

- Military leaders insisted that taking land was the only way out of depression
- September 1931: Japan invaded Manchuria (breaking Treaty of Versailles)
- October 1931: Emperor Hirohito ordered troops withdrawn – Tojo refused!
- Tojo has taken control of the government!
- "Rape of Nanking" (1937): Japan invaded Nanking (Nanjing) – killed 300,000 residents
- 1941: Tojo took complete control as Prime Minister of Japan
