

Teach-Ins Begin

- Spring 1965: 1st American combat troops arrived in Vietnam
 - 66% of America approved!
- What caused America to turn on the Vietnam War?
 - The length of the war
 - The lack of understanding of the war efforts
 - <u>Credibility Gap</u>: lack of trust or believability (especially from the White House)
- March 1965: University of Michigan faculty held a "teach-in"
 - Discussed the issues surrounding the war
 - Explained why they opposed the war
 - By May 1965, 122 colleges joined the protest with a national teach-in via radio

Anger at the Draft

What about the draft?

Many protested this event - seeing it as unethical

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS)

- Organized a March on Washington, DC
- 20,000 people attended rallied at the Lincoln Memorial
- Others protested this group's efforts

What was the concern about the draft?

- Many saw this as an unfair draft NOT a declared war... a military conflict
- Many attempted to evade the draft: attending college (until 1969), deferring military service
- Most draftees came from working-class families
- African Americans made up ~10% of military personnel and ~20% of combat deaths







The Tet Offensive

- What is the Tet Offensive?
 - Tet is the Vietnamese New Year celebration.
 - In 1968, the Vietcong staged a surprise attack on this date...
- Why is this event so significant?
 - A week-long truce had been declared to respect the Vietnamese celebration.
- What happened in this event?
 - During the celebration, firecrackers, flutes, and coffins are used.
 - The coffins contained guns and munitions.
 - The Vietcong (among the crowd) attacked over 100 towns, 12 US air bases.
 - This offensive lasted for 1 month before the US and South Vietnamese regained control.
 - Gen. Westmoreland declared the offensive a military defeat for the Vietcong...??



Johnson Leaves the Race

- 1967: Johnson and Vietnam had both become UNPOPULAR
 - Eugene McCarthy declared that he would challenge President Johnson for the Democratic nomination
 - Senator Robert Kennedy also announced he would seek the Democratic nomination
 - March 1968: McCarthy has a strong following dividing the Democratic party
 - President Johnson announced he WOULD NOT seek reelection
- What happened at the 1968 Democratic Convention?
 - Protests and violence outside AND inside the convention - it was CHAOS!
 - Vice President Hubert Humphrey was chosen as the candidate - against the will of the party









A Season of Violence

- What happened next SHOCKED the nation!
 - April 4, 1968: Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated in Memphis.
 - June 5, 1968: Robert Kennedy was assassinated by Sirhan Sirhan (an Arab national)
- American reaction...
 - 1968 was chaotic!!! Thousands would protest the Democratic Convention
 - Taunted & fought with police
 - Chanted: "The whole world is watching"
 - Demonstrations and violent protests occurred on over 100 college campuses.







Nixon Wins the Presidency

- Nixon's return to the White House was considered one of the greatest political "comebacks"
 - Remember that Nixon lost the presidential election in 1960.
- What promises did Nixon make to America?
 - Restore law and order
 - End the Vietnam War
- Was there a "catch" in this election?
 - Yes...Gov. George Wallace (a democrat) entered the race as a third-party candidate.
 - Remember what we have talked about concerning splitting a political party!!!
 - Wallace championed segregation and states' rights
 - Attracted protest-weary white voters....and disenfranchised many other voters.
 - Vietnam would end under Nixon's term
